<u>City Manager Summary</u>: At the June 12th Finance and Personnel Committee meeting, the committee supported setting Franchise Fees for the purpose of protecting the City's future revenue structure knowing that property tax cut mandates are coming to all Cities. In order to initate this process, the City must commit to a final revenue purpose statement according to Ahlers & Cooney, the City's bond counsel. In this discussion, City Staff seeks final direction on the path of resources generated from Franchise Fees.

For initial June 12th committee discussion purposes, Staff offered the following revenue purpose statement for use of the Franchise Fee funds:

Black Hills Energy was consulted in the drafting of the above chart. Their figures incorporated the average of the previous 3 financial years and not the current year which had extraordinarily high gas prices.

Some initial thoughts at the June 12th committee meeting were to focus on Parks but City Management also wants to ensure we are adequately funding property tax reduction strategies absorbed by the General Fund including Police & Fire Vehicle CIP fundings.
